

Just when we thought that there was some progress in the fight against Covid-19, suddenly the infection rates have skyrocketed, and the isolation levels have gone back up all around the

country.

Our own SIR activities have been shut down completely, even golf, in a rather strange decision by the State SIR office. We're hoping that they will reconsider that decision in time to resume our golf activities for the new year's schedule.

In the meantime, keep thinking of potential members who might want to join our branch when some activities begin again.

I keep in touch with my contact person at Morton Golf; Golf Expo next year is possible but certainly not assured. Like so much in our lives now, it's a wait and see situation. I'll keep you posted on news there.

Stay safe and healthy.

All the bowling news is discouraging right now. Sacramento County, along with almost all other counties in the state, has moved to the highest level of Covid-19 restrictions. This move lessens the chances of bowling venues opening any time soon. Even worse, the State Sir office has suspended all SIR activities, even golf. That move further decreases the possibility of a return to SIR bowling in the immediate future.

I have been in regular contact with Bobbi Nicholson at Country Club Lanes. She has not heard anything from Sacramento County about a timeline for re-opening bowling alleys. As I mentioned last month, we will have to make some decisions about how to manage our season:

- start late and run longer into May or June
- start late and have a shortened season
- start late and do a combination of the above choices

We also have to face the possibility that we won't have any bowling season at all this year. If it gets into the start of 2021 with no reopening of the lanes, we will have to consider that question. I hope that will not happen, but the most important issue will be the safety of our bowlers. It looks like we may be running out of time for a safe return to our bowling league.


