- A hands-free microphone system is also provided
- Tables to check in our members as they arrive at the luncheon; several long tables for our "Book Exchange" and our "Apparel Display" are also provided.

To sum up this issue, another <u>Question to the Branch</u>? Is it appropriate that most members pay for their lunch and a few do not want to pay just because they think that the price is too high?
