



Loren Jacobs is recovering from a serious (hospital and quarantine at home) bout with COVID-19. By the time you read this he should be out of home quarantine. He said he is feeling pretty good.

Tom Page recently underwent arm surgery for a cancerous tumor and then got pneumonia and was hospitalized for three days. He's recovering slowly and the arm surgery, though successful, will have to be repeated in November.

PBS Jim Carlson just got out of the hospital. I reached out and received the following from his daughter, Jodi:

"Thank you for reaching out. He came home today. He had a bowel blockage, septic shock and pneumonia. He was at MSJ ICU for 5 days, regular hospital room for 3 days and 2.5 weeks at a skilled nursing facility. He is still pretty weak and tires easily but he's a fighter. In the last week his progress has been remarkable. We're so happy to have him home. My sisters and I will be here 24/7 until we feel he and my mom are ok on their own.

I don't think he would mind if you let the membership know. Please also ask that everyone get vaccinated. We delayed going to the ER because they are overwhelmed with COVID patients and due to COVID restrictions we couldn't visit at all in the hospital and visits were limited in the skilled nursing facility. This won't end until everyone is vaccinated."

Best wishes and prayers for the continuing recovery of our friends.
