
Message from Mark

Bill was born in Bakersfield but grew up in nearby Wasco, Seattle and Sacramento. He joined the Navy just out of high school and began a long life of military service. During his enlistment in the Navy, Bill was a signalman using signal flags, flashing lights and semaphore. His first service was on a LST 1177 landing craft. Later, he served on a larger LPH 3 (helicopter carrier) and sailed from the east coast through the Panama Canal to San Diego. The ship then headed to Viet Nam in the Da Nang area. Bill served two tours off the coast of Viet Nam supporting Marine Corps operations before returning to the US and civilian life. He worked as a locksmith initially before becoming a school bus driver, which he did for the rest of his working career.

Bill wasn't done with military service, though. He joined the Naval Reserves in 1980 and then transferred to the Army National Guard. That turned into a real adventure when his unit was called up to serve in the Desert Storm/Desert Shield conflicts supporting Marine Corps operations again. Bill was a 40-ton truck driver in Saudi Arabia for this period. He later re-joined the Naval Reserve and served until 1997.

Jim was born in Weissbaden, Germany, as part of a military family. He grew up in Germany, Spain, Ohio, Seattle, and Riverside. After high school, he worked at several jobs, including Tower Waterbeds, before going to work for his father's window installation business. Jim and his wife Rhonda have a son and a 3-yer old grandson. Jim loves golf and plays a lot now, just as he used to do with softball leagues. He was an avid softball player for years until his knees just couldn't take it anymore. Jim also likes to travel and follows a lot of professional sports.
