Mark's Talk

On November 11th our speaker was author Larry Brooks. He spoke about his book, *Tan Tru*, published in 2013. It chronicles events that unfolded during 1968 and early 1969, when the author served as a

young infantry soldier in the United States Army with Charlie Company, 2nd/60th Infantry, 9th Infantry Division in Vietnam's Mekong Delta. *Tan Tru* has consistently ranked among *Amazon's Top 100 Best Selling Vietnam War Memoirs and Biographies* since the year 2017.

Both allow our families to join with us in these activities. We will be bringing these and other activities back next year. We also must increase our recruitment efforts to attract new members. We help keep the cost of these activities down by paying for venue rental space, the cost of entertainment, wine at our luncheons and other expenses.

Our budget for 2022 will be more than \$3000. With your continued support, we will be able to continue to
