
Finally, stay healthy. Be as active as you can. Activity helps not just your physical health, but also your mental wellbeing.

Chris is a native Sacramentan, mostly growing up here and graduating from Encina High School. Chris attended American River College for 2 years and then Chico State University for 3 more years, earning a degree in civil engineering. He also worked for Granite Construction during his college years.

After college, Chris worked for the city of Benicia as the assistant public works director before going to work for his dad in his concrete construction business, and getting his CA contractors license. Later, Chris worked for several major construction companies in the Sacramento area as a project manager. He also spent time working in Atlanta, Georgia and worked for a period for himself as an independent project manager. Most of his later working years were with the California General Services Department, both as a regular employee and as a retired annuitant.

In 1996, Chris was seriously injured in a car accident. Ultimately, he lost his left leg at the knee level. Thanks to a positive attitude and a great prosthetic specialist, Chris stayed active and returned to many of his former activities, including skiing and cycling. Gary was born in New Brunswick, New Jersey, and grew up there. After high school, he remained in the area to attend Rutgers University, all the while working outside jobs. He earned a commission in the Air Force through ROTC, but before actively serving, he spent a year as an investigator with the New Jersey Division of Civil Rights.

Gary served in the Air Force, first in Sacramento at Mather AFB, where he trained as a B-52 navigator and later in South Dakota. He did a tour over Viet Nam and, in one instance, helped his plane evade a missile sent to shoot them down!

Following his Air Force service, Gary went to McGeorge School of Law in Sacramento, graduating in the top 25% of his class. He passed the bar on his first attempt and joined the Sacramento Public Defenders office, the first Black man to hold this position. Later, Governor Jerry Brown appointed him as a judge in the Municipal Court; ultimately, Governor Deukmejian appointed him to the Superior Court. Gary retired at age 60 but kept serving as a court judge until age 77. He lists teaching classes at Sac State while on the bench and community volunteer work to his list of accomplishments.

Gary recently lost his wife, Gloria, after several years of severe illness. He likes to do 2 or 3 crossword puzzles each morning.

### SACRAMENTO STATE SIR BOWLING TOURNAMENT

The results are in for the Sacramento State SIR bowling tournament, held February 16 & 17 at Country Club Lanes. The event had 97 participants, 22 from our own branch. Several other Sacramento area branches also were represented. In addition, participants came from 18 branches in Napa, Vallejo, Grass Valley, Nevada City, Concord, Walnut Creek, Marysville and Pollock Pines.

Prize money for the tournament totaled nearly \$2,900, plus about \$800 in door prizes was given out. The door prizes included 6 new bowling balls and 2 new bowling pins.

Almost half of the Branch 69 bowlers collected prize money. The big winners were Big Sir Alan Weinel (\$134), Hal Copperberg (\$86), Jim Happs (\$80), and Jerry Buhlert (\$76). Many thanks to Connor Chin and Tod Davis, co-chairs for the event, Treasurer Hal Copperberg, and several volunteers for their hard work putting on the tournament.
