September is Team Play Month and will be a lot of fun! We have two tournaments:

First up is Ancil Hoffman which will be a Two Person Blind Draw (High/Low) format. Not familiar with this format? Here's how it works:

Pairings will consist of one higher handicap and one lower handicap player. Each pairing will be made by random drawings from two pots, one with the names of higher handicap participants, the other drawing from lower handicap participants.

Players will not know the identity of their paired partner at tee time or during play, their partner could be in any of the tournament foursomes. Foursomes will be made as usual and each player can choose the tees that they want to play from.

The pairings will be disclosed on a sheet located in the SIRS box in the clubhouse at the end of the tournament. Results will be calculated using the respective handicaps of each pairing for the tees that each player chose. Awards will be given for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place Low Net.

Our second tournament will be at Mather GC, a Four Person Shamble format. You can choose your team (write the names of your team players somewhere on the front or back of the sign-up sheet) or if you wish, I can place you on a team.




#### SUNSHINE
