We finished off the 2024-2025 bowling season with high drama: the Alley Oops team (George Langford, Hal Copperberg, Les Kurtz and Captain Alex Canada) defeated Team 5 (Neal McCoy, Rich Herr, Emory Haworth and Captain David Bozeman) in a very close match to win the second half of the season. Because Alley Oops!!! also won the first half, that gave them the Championship for the season. 2nd place for the year was decided by the most overall wins total (behind Alley Oops!!!)—that prize went to team Spare Parts (Adrian Garcia, Alan Weinel, Tom Page and Captain James Aylett).

Other notable awards included Jim Smalling for his usual high season average (208), Ken Barber with the high scratch game (279), high handicap game, Nate Gauff (304), high scratch series, Jim Smalling (704), and high handicap series, Patrick Fintel (788). Patrick also was our most improved bowler for the year, raising his average from 125 to 147.

Each year, we hand out awards in three age brackets for the highest game over average. The winners this year were:

Under 72 years old: Lt Coopwood (224 game over 158 average = 86 pins)

Age 72-78, tie between Neal McCoy: (255 game over 175 average = 80 pins) and Brian Thurston (258 game over 178 average = 80 pins)

Over 79 years old: Tom Page (234 game over 146 average = 88 pins)

All in all, we handed out just about \$6,000 in prize money to our bowlers!

We also elected our officers for the coming year; it was not much of a contest as all the existing officers are staying in their current positions.

There were some initial growing pains as the leagues got used to the new format, but with some hard work and a little diplomacy, the format soon smoothed out. Special thanks to Bobbi Nicholson for her continuing support and to Chris Alvarez for his work with our bowling stats.

In late June, I'll start contacting our existing bowlers to get them signed up for the season next fall. We can always use more bowlers, so let me know if you want to join our bowling fun.

Other bowling information:

If you're in the league and want to practice bowl, identify yourself as a SIR league bowler at the front desk at Country Club Lanes and you can bowl for \$.50/ game, an increase from the previous \$.25/game. It's still a huge bargain. Also, if you still have some of those old free bowling coupons from making splits, Country Club Lanes will continue to honor them. These special rates apply all year round.




