

EASY PUMPKIN BREAD (MAKES TWO LOAVES)

3½ cups sifted flour 2 teaspoons nutmeg

1 cup salad oil 1 cup chopped nuts 2 teaspoons soda ¼ teaspoon ginger

4 eggs

1½ teaspoons salt ½ teaspoon ground cloves

2/3 cup water

1 teaspoon cinnamon

3 cups sugar

1 can (15 oz.) pumpkin

Grease and flour two 9x5x3 inch loaf pans. Sift together first seven ingredients and place in large mixing bowl. Mix remaining ingredients in a separate bowl. Add to dry ingredients and mix well. Divide batter into two loaf pans. Bake in preheated 325° oven for about $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours, or until done. Cool slightly before removing from pan.

Notes From the SIR, Inc., Annual Meeting Held on Sept. 24, 2024 And the Future of SIR by Robert Schrumpf

The 1st Presidential Award was awarded to Rick Kindle, who was a past President of SIR, Inc.

It was re-emphasized that the Social aspects of SIR are just as important as the physical activities. Growing the chapters with new members while interacting with each other is important.

Every branch is autonomous and different, reflecting the local community. SIR, Inc is the parent organization, developing a Strategic Plan for the organization, and implementing plans for the benefit of the whole organization. But note that SIR, Inc is run by volunteers.

In the past, there was a SIR Newsletter, called "SIR Happenings." But the newsletter ceased being published when it lost its editor and no one took up the position.

SIR used to be a much larger organization, At one time it had 270 branches, but now it is down to about 100. There used to be 31,972 members (back in 1992), but now there are just 8,640.

SIR, Inc wants to get our organization's name and purpose publicized and more distributed throughout Northern and Central California. We need to increase our visibility in the community.

It has been said that those men aged 60-69 are considered the Baby Boomers II, and that is the demographic that SIRs should be targeting. The median age of SIR members is over 79 years.

SIR, Inc is considering taking on the process of changing its status to a 501(c)(3) organization, so that donations can be tax-deductible. This came about because Kaiser Healthcare talked with SIR, Inc about distributing Grant money, but Kaiser advised that SIR, Inc needed to be a 501(c)(3) for that to happen.

SIR, VP, Lee Lamp, talked about their 2024 accomplishments; a study of attrition rates and various in-person and ZOOM meetings.

In looking at the first six months of the year 2024, SIR, Inc lost a net total of 204 members. But there were 4 branches that actually grew over 10% (branches 62, 171, 7, and 17).

SIR, Inc now has two main goals: Increase Membership and Finding Leadership.

There was a Training Announcement; on Nov 8, 2024 there will be a Zoom meeting on "Running Your Branch" - branch leadership training. This will be from 10am til Noon. Emails will be sent to branch leaders.

Rich Carlston (current SIR, Inc President) presented his vision for 2025:

- We must define who we are. What kind of organization are we? Are we a Men's Selective Social Club, or are we a Senior's Community Activities Club?
 - Training of officers and corporate leaders is important.
 - Membership growth is needed.
 - Staffing at SIR, Inc is needed, so that we can im plement our strategic plans.

Rich Carlston noted the significance of losing members. Losing members, means losing activities. We then lose our leaders, and then we lose the branch. He ended the meeting with a summary of SIR, Inc (The State's) needs:

- An assistant for the Newsletter.
- The State needs an Asst. Treasurer, and an Asst. Sectry.
- A Director (and an Assistant) of State Documents.
- An Asst. Director for Branch Support.
- A Director for Branch Activities.
- A lawyer, familiar with non-profit organizations to help SIR, Inc in dealing with our hired law firm.
