Alzheimer's
Vascular
Lewy Body
Frontotemporal
Other, including Huntington's
Mixed Dementia ( dementia from more than one cause

She then talked about the warning signs of dementia:

- 1. Memory loss that disrupt daily life
- 2. Challenges in planning or solving problems
- 3. Difficulty completing familiar tasks
- 4. Confusion with time and place
- 5. Trouble understanding visual images and spatial relations
- 6. New problems with words in speaking or writing
- 7. Misplacing things and losing the ability to retrace steps
- 8. Decreased or poor judgement
- 9. Withdrawal from work or social activities
- 10. Changes in personality
